 The Cinder Track forms part of larger cycle networks including:
 • National Route 1 of the National Cycle Network, a long distance route connecting Oxford and the Mendips Islands
 • The Route to the Cycles House linking the towns of Scarborough, Pickering and Whitby via stunning moorlands, beautiful forests and historic buildings.
 • The North Sea Cycle Route, the world's longest signed international cycle route, passing through seven countries around the North Sea.
 The National Cycle Network is coordinated by sustainable transport charity Sustrans.
